### LOCATION

Located in the Plaza de las Descalzas. This square also houses the Convent of the Nuns of Saint Clare, built by Emperor Carlos V and fully established by King Felipe II. The nearby mausoleum known as Panteón de Tres Infantas is one of the city's most frequented monuments. Just 30 metres from the hotel are the Plaza Mayor, the Puerta del Sol and the Royal Theatre, and 100 metres from the Royal Palace and Madrid's famous Gran Vía avenue, the city's commercial and cultural nerve centre.

## HOW TO GET THERE

### FROM THE AIRPORT

You may take a taxi, or opt for the underground train, the Metro, which you will find in the airport. If taking the Metro, take line 8 to the Nuevos Ministerios stop. From there, take Line 10 to Alonso Martínez, and then change trains to Line 5 (heading towards Casa de Campo), getting off at the Opera Metro station. Room Mate Laura is just a two-minute walk from there.

### GETTING AROUND THE CITY ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Laura is very close to the Puerta del Sol, where you will find bus stops for the 10, 151, 12 bus lines, which virtually cover the entire city. Also nearby is the Sol Metro station, where three different Metro lines converge: the 1 (blue), the 2 (red) and the 3 (yellow).
