HOW TO GET THERE

FROM THE AIRPORT

If you arrive by plane, you may take a taxi from the Pablo Ruiz Picasso Airport itself, or you can take the RENFE local train ("cercanías" Line C-1 towards Málaga, getting off at the "Málaga-María Zambrano" stop), which will take you right into the centre of town. Line 19 (Airport-Paseo del Parque) also stops at the main avenue Alameda Principal, just a few metres away from the hotel.

GETTING AROUND THE CITY ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

This is the most complete option to get to Room Mate Lola, as all of the public transport stops can be found between La Alameda Principal and El Paseo del Parque, in the city centre, very close to the hotel.
