## HOW TO GET THERE

### FROM THE AIRPORT

If you arrive by plane, there is only one bus that will take you to Salamanca, and it arrives in the bus station. From there, you can take bus line 4 which will drop you off close to the hotel. There are taxis in both the airport and the bus station, which will drop you off right at the door of the hotel.

### BY CAR

The hotel has its own private garage. You may take advantage of this service for 9 euros a day (VAT included). We recommend reserving your parking space ahead of time, as the hotel does not have as many parking spaces as it does rooms.
